New Food safe requirements

Members are reminded that with the introduction of new State Legislation, there are now strict rules regarding the use of the new kitchen facilities. Anyone preparing or serving food (generally, any work in the kitchen) need to have undergone the required traning.

It is not onerous and all of the new social committee have the required qualifications. Please see one of them if you wish to use the facilities or would like to get the qualification.

Outstanding Accounts

Airfield Matters

We have had 6 days that recorded rain during May to a total of 36mm of rainfall. There is grass cover now on the airfield in most areas.

However, the drought has taken its toll as the Government will be implementing water restrictions for the coming year. This will take effect as of July 1st this year and will be introduced regardless of how much rain Australia gets this winter. Our water allowance will be set for the next 12 months or until the restrictions are lifted. We are likely to receive less than we need.

We will all have to be careful of our water usage for the next 12 months. It will be important that we not use water in areas not required. This includes things like washing cars or other non-essential uses. It also means that some areas of grass around the clubhouse will be watered less. Staff will strictly regulate water usage. Please avoid wastage.

If you have time up your sleeve and want a job. The Creeping Saltbush on the pads, in the van park & around the Clubhouse is seeding. You will notice small red berries on the plants. Gently pull them out, place them into a bucket and transport them to a bin, hopefully with the berries still attached.

Fleet

Accommodation

We are now taking bookings for accommodation to members and pilots for the National Club Class Comps period. All accommodation on site will now require a 50% deposit to secure your bed. This will help assure we have maximum occupancy during the Club Class Comps as well as alleviate some of the financial burden we normally suffer during the winter.

Any Accommodation bookings cancelled before

November 1st will receive a deposit refund the same as our glider bookings.

Test your Knowledge An Answer

The time to complete a turn will decrease with increasing bank angle. However the rate of descent will increase with increasing bank angle. Although the stall speed will increase with increasing bank angle (100% increase at 75 degrees), the loss of height will vary from a maximum at low bank angle because the turn takes longer to complete, to a minimum where the time taken to complete the turn occurs at a favourable sink rate and increases again as the increase in bank angle produces an increase in sink despite the shorter time for the turn.

An angle of 45 degrees generally results in minimum height loss.
